

## Bali Bags Supply List (Fabric Covered Clothesline Crafts Tote Bags)

### **Tote Bag (12” wide X 11” high)**

- Bali Bags Pattern by Aunties Two
- 36 – 2 ½ “ X 42” fabric strips (more if you want a taller bag). Strips are for bag, handles and binding
- 125’ of 3/16” or 7/32” in diameter COTTON clothesline, rated for 12 lbs. ((It can have a non-cotton (synthetic) core as long as it is soft and flexible))
  - DO NOT USE POLY CLOTHESLINE**
- Matching Cotton Thread – This project used a lot of thread! Before beginning, pre-fill at least 3 bobbins. A 50 weight 2-ply thread is perfect for this project. The sample was done with the Mettler piecing thread. 2 ½ spools were used
- Optional Lining and pockets: 1 yard of matching batik fabric
- Embellishments: Buttons to cover the end of the handles, or maybe something else! Have fun!
- Machine in good working order that has a good zigzag stitch. A free arm machine is also preferred, but not necessary
- Machine needles 90/14 or 100/16. (I used Schmetz Jeans needles-make sure you have a few!)
- Machine extension table
- Scissors, rotary cutter, seam ripper, measuring tape, pins and any other usual sewing notions you might like to use

### **Squared Bag (12” high X 12” wide X 6” deep)**

- Bali Squared Bag Pattern by Aunties Two
- 3 ½ yards total (or one Bali Pop and 1 yard)
 

Body of the bag	36	2 ½” X 42” Fabric Strips
Binding and handles	7	2 ½” X 42” Fabric Strips
Interior Pockets	2	12” X 16” Fabric Rectangles
- 2 pieces of fusible fleece – 12” X 8”
- 150’ of 6/32” to 7/32” in diameter COTTON Clothesline. ((It can have a non-cotton (synthetic) core as long as it is soft and flexible))
  - DO NOT USE POLY CLOTHESLINE**
- Matching Cotton Thread – This project used a lot of thread! Before beginning, pre-fill at least 3 bobbins. A 50 weight 2-ply thread is perfect for this project. A 40 weight 3-ply thread (which is heavier) should be used for hand sewing the sides.
- ½” Cotton Upholstery Piping – 2 yards
- Machine in good working order that has a good zigzag stitch. A free arm machine is also preferred, but not necessary
- Machine needles 90/14 or 100/16. (I used Schmetz Jeans needles-make sure you have a few!)
- Machine extension table
- Scissors, rotary cutter, seam ripper, measuring tape, pins, wide painter’s tape and any other usual sewing notions you might like to use

<b>Bali Bag - Large</b>	
<b><u>Supplies needed:</u></b>	<b><u>Amount:</u></b>
"Bali Bag" Pattern	1 Pattern
2 ½" strips – assort. Colors	15 strips (may not use them all)
Lining Fabric	1 ¾ yds.
Bottom & Handles	½ yd.
Top flap	¼ yd.
Batting (thin or stiffer)	1 ½ yd.
Fast 2 Fuse ultra heavyweight Interfacing w/ fusible web on 1 side.	6" x 15"
Medium weight interfacing	1 ½ yd. (can be fusible, but not mandatory)
Magnetic closure	1
Spray Baste	If interfacing is not fusible
Thread	Matching main fabric and if embroidering on the strips, colors to match or contrast.
Strip of Velcro	1" or more for pockets

Rotary Cutter, scissors, mat	Cutting of patterns and fabric
Pins, marking utensil other common notions	

<b>#1181 Gadget Girl Bag</b>	
<b><u>Supplies needed:</u></b>	<b><u>Amount:</u></b>
"#1180 Gadget Girl Bag" Pattern	1 Pattern
Fat Quarters– assort. Colors (bag top and flap, handles) **1/3 yd. needed if fabric is directional. Fat quarters must be at least 18"x21"	3
Lining Fabric, interior pockets & purse base cover	1 1/8 yd.
Bag Center Strap	1/8 yd or 1fat eighth
Fusible fleece for interfacing	1 ¼ yd.
Timtex or piece of cardboard for purse base	9"X6"
¼" elastic	1 package
Large Decorative button	1
Magnetic closures or velcro	3
Spray Baste	If interfacing is not fusible
Thread	Matching main fabric and if embroidering on the strips, colors to match or contrast.
